Letter from the president



It was so nice to see so many people come out for the annual Challah Shabbat at the lovely home of Mike and Shawn Daus in Teton Village. They are so gracious and might I add brave, to open their kitchen to so many fledgling challah testosteroneers. Josh Kleyman, our resident master/maven challah maker/baker, supervised the whole megillah. I can attest first-hand that he's a good instructor as the challahs we used for the Kiddush were hot out of the oven and tasted great. Chazzan Judd couldn't be there to lead us in singing some of the Shabbat prayers but not to worry as his daughter Esther and Aviva Thal filled in admirably with their sweet and lovely voices to lead us. We are so blessed to have these two wonderful young ladies as members of the JHJC. Not only can they fill in as junior cantors but they also teach at Bet Sefer, as well.

The JHJC board of directors has been struggling lately with the issue of how to help and what role the JHJC should play when a member of the community dies leaving no known family contacts or instructions for funeral arrangements. The board understands the sensitive and private nature of this issue but feels strongly that we need to be prepared when called upon to help, especially when there seems like there is

no one else to do so. We have many single members in our community and we are concerned that their wishes will not be honored or family members not contacted because that sort of information is not known by anyone locally. The Board, short of formally setting up an information data bank for those members who are interested, although it is certainly an option worth exploring, urges its single members to give local friends their family contact information, if nothing else.

Although it is a subject that so many of us avoid talking about it is important that families have discussed how much of Jewish tradition they want to follow should the circumstances arise so the family does not have to anguish over such details when they are so distraught over the loss of a loved one. There are many rituals to consider, what kind of funeral to have, did he or she want to be interred in a consecrated Jewish cemetery, and on and on. It is a lot to think about and you can imagine how difficult it would be for your family to have to figure out when they are emotionally wrought.

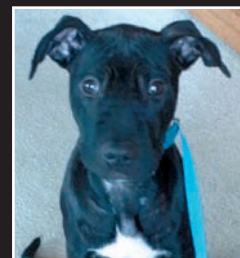

It is a blessing to do that for them so they don't have to guess.

Obituaries: Feinbergs loved travel, Israel

Julius "Jules" Reiner Feinberg was born in Kerhonkson, NY, December 25, 1921. He passed away in El Dorado, AR, September 10, 2010. He is preceded in death by his mother and father, Abraham and Rebecca (Reiner) Feinberg and his brothers, Henry and Seymour Feinberg. He is survived by his loving wife of 60 years, Johanna, three children, David (Jane) Feinberg of El Dorado, Dorothy (Bob) Wells of Afton, WY, and Myra Sellers of Memphis, TN and three grandchildren, Sam, Thomas, and Meredith.

He served in the U. S. Army during WWII in the South Pacific and later received an Army Specialized Training certificate from the University of Minnesota. He earned a BS in Mechanical Engineering from Northeastern University, Boston, MA, and was a Registered Professional Engineer in Arkansas and Mississippi.

Jules' career in Engineering brought him to El Dorado in the early 1950's where by 1957 he founded Pumps and Power Company, served as Chief Engineer, and was an innovator in the packaged/modular pumping industry.

He was active in the B'Nai Brith, Jewish men's organization and served as Arkansas state president 1963-64. He was an avid reader, patron of the arts and loved traveling the world with his beloved wife, Jo. He will be remembered for his colorful stories, entrepreneurial spirit and determination.

Johanna S. Feinberg was born in Gilford, CT on October 22, 1923. She passed away in El Dorado, AR on December 13, 2011. She is pre-

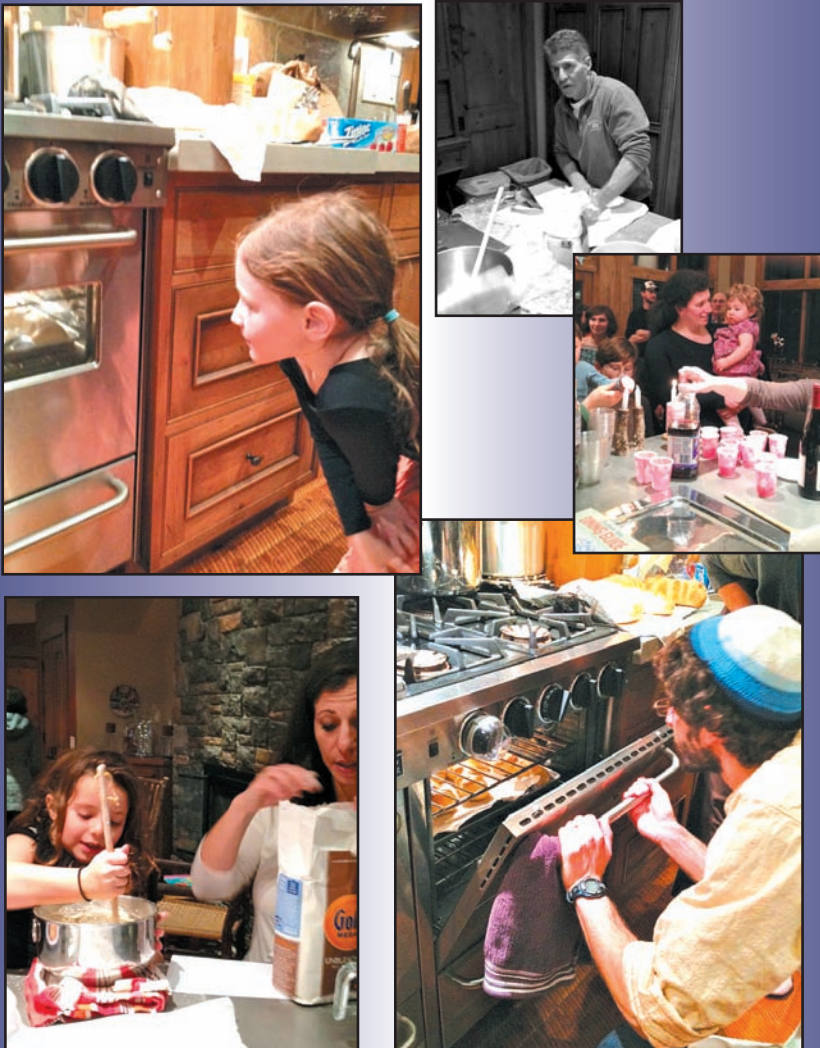
