



PASSOVER: PART OF THE BLUEPRINT FOR SPIRITUAL AWAKENING By Carol Mann

One way to experience the progression of holidays around the Hebrew calendar year is as a series of directions for spiritual evolution and awakening. Embedded into the stories and customs for each holiday are suggestions to follow if you choose a more conscious connection to God and to experience your own Divinity in every day life.

Below are three of the many specific directives for engaging a higher spiritual path offered in the story and customs of Passover. I know that sharing the points below is only the first step... living them is the challenge. Thankfully there is grace, compassion and forgiveness included in the cycle of holidays and every day along the way....

1. The spiritual corollary to removing yeast and other ingredients which puff up food, is to put aside the ego. Putting the static of the never satisfied ego voice in the passenger's seat allows the wisdom and peacefulness of the soul to resonate, revealing the big picture perspective and connection with the Divine.

2.The spiritual corollary to cleaning the house of the chametz



(remnants of foods containing leavening) is the opportunity to let go of internal mental and emotional clutter interfering with living a higher spiritual path. Conscious connection to the Divine also requires space.

3.In the recounting of the Exodus story, it is said that all the Hebrews and Egyptians escaping Pharoh's regime stood on the shores of the Red Sea paralyzed with fear about how to proceed. The sea was in front of them; the Egyptian armies gaining on them from behind. One person then stepped out from the crowds and walked into the sea up to his chin. At that moment the seas began to part. Here is another key to the awakened spiritual path... it is co-creative... by stepping into the unknown, by engaging with God, what is possible is revealed.
