# Sex, Death and History: Rashi and the Serpent in the Garden of Eden

His talk will be at 7 p.m., in the Dining Room Breakout at Teton Science Schools, Highway 22 West of Jackson. Rabbi Goldstein notes that 2005 was the 900th anniversary of the death of Rabbi Shlomo Yitzhaki - Rashi (940 - 1105). He is our greatest commentator of the Bible and Talmud. Rabbi Goldstein will take the x-rated Garden of Eden story and discuss its Freudian aspects regarding the contact between

the Serpent and Eve, as Rashi understood it, then add his own take on what it really teaches about sexuality, disobedience and the origins of time and history.

Rabbi Goldstein received his doctorate from St. Mary's Seminary and University in 1974. He is Rabbi Emeritus of one of the oldest Reform congregations in the country, Touro Synagogue in New Orleans. He has been a Professor of Jewish Studies at Tulane University since 1978. He specializes in

Medieval Jewish History, Intellectual History of the Jews of the Renaissance, and Cultural History of the Jews of Moslem Spain. David and his wife Shannie have been frequent visitors to Jackson. We hope you will join us to welcome the Goldsteins to Jackson and for an enlightening and enriching weekend.



#### Holocaust Survivor Talk



Holocaust survivor Erwin Deutsch spoke last month about his experiences to about 100 people at St. John's Fellowship Hall. The audience sat in rapt attention for about two hours while Mr. Deutsch related Germany's social and political history preceding the Holocaust and how he and most of his family managed to survive those years. While he was in town visiting his daughter Claudia MacMillan and grandchildren, Mr. Deutsch also spoke with Bet Sefer students and with students at the Jackson Hole High and Middle Schools. # **Driving Directions to the Jackson Campus**

### From Jackson:

At the intersection of Broadway to the US 89/191 and HWY 22 (Albertsons & Jackson State Bank on your left). Turn onto HWY 22. Head west on HWY 22 for approx. 1.7 miles. Watch for the Teton Science Schools sign on the left at Coyote Canyon Road. Turn right onto Coyote Canyon Road. Follow Coyote Canyon Road .6 miles to the Jackson Campus.

#### From the west:

Follow HWY 22 (from Teton Pass) east to the town of Wilson. Stay on HWY22. You will reach the HWY 390 junction after approx. 1.5 miles. Continue on HWY 22. Travel approx. 2.4 miles past the HWY 390 junction. Watch for the Teton Science Schools sign on the left at Coyote Canyon Road. Turn left onto Coyote Canyon Road and follow it .6 miles to the Jackson Campus.

## **Parking**

Once people are on Coyote Canyon Road they should precede down to the campus area. Parking can be found in the lot to the right of the entrance road, along 45 minute and 5 minute temporary parking closer to the buildings.

The campus is dark in the evenings, so we would encourage those unsure with the lighting to bring a flashlight for their pocket. The campus is primarily pedestrian on snowy paths, so appropriate footwear should be worn.

The program will take place in the dining lodge. This is the third building on the left as you enter the campus. It is a five minute walk into the dining lodge from the parking lot.

If you have mobility issues, there is vehicular access to the dining lodge. We need to let the School know.
