Our new Board is large. The consensus was that this was good because people in Jackson tend to travel, so if everyone who

is here makes attending meetings a top priority we will always have a large enough group for good discussions and decisions. We presented a working budget which had a \$20,000 deficit. Now, the decision making process of how to adjust—spend less, raise more and/or more volunteer work — will begin.

We already have discussed the means to lower the deficit to about \$5,000 and today we received a large contribution with \$5,000 directed to Bet Sefer. So I don't think money will be the major question. Rather we must ask how much we are will-

ing to spent on leadership. Adult study, for example, could be led by members without a Rabbi.

Our members have gotten a second wind in terms of volunteering. Each month one member of the board will host Shabbat and will also take on one major responsibility during the year. Phyllis Turtle and Eve Scofield announced that they would chair the Purim party this year as a fund-raiser for Bet Sefer.

know. Would you like the Board meeting minutes emailed each month? Something else? Let us know.

Please remember that Board members are congregation members too. They just want the JHJC to be here for all of us.




Yiddish Trivia (with thanks to Merle Lundy)
