





Hamentaschen Help

(recipe from http://www.torahbytes.org/sechel/ Hamentaschen.htm)

2/3 cup butter 1/2 cup sugar 1 egg 1/4 cup orange juice 1 cup white flour 1 cup wheat flour Filling Blend butter and sugar. Add the egg and blend. Add juice and blend. Add flour, 1/2 cup at a time, alternating

white and wheat. Blend. Refrigerate batter three hours. Roll thin. Cut out 3 or 4 inch circles. Put a tablespoon of filling in the middle of each circle. Fold up the sides to make a triangle, overlapping the sides as much as possible so only a little filling shows through the middle. Squeeze the corners tightly. Bake at 375 degrees for about 10 minutes or until golden brown.

Jackson Hole Hasty Hamentaschen

Store bought sugar cookie dough makes a good base for Hamentaschen. Just slice the dough thin, roll it a bit bigger, put a spoonful of filling of your choice in the middle and pinch the corners up into a triangle shape. Bake as with prior recipe.
