JHJCC hires J-Play instructor, begins Nov. 3

I am very pleased to join the Jackson Hole Jewish Community as J-Play's new preschool instructor. I recently relocated to Jackson Hole from my hometown of Milwaukee, WI, where Jewish learning played an integral role in my childhood. My most formative Judaic experiences include Jewish summer camp in the Wisconsin north woods, assisting Hebrew school and special education Sunday school at the synagogue where I became a Bat Mitzvah,

travelling to Israel under the Birthright program, and attending the Milwaukee Jewish Day School, where I began a now decade-long study of modern Hebrew.

One of my favorite aspects of Judaism is the high value it places on

lifelong learning, beginning both religious and secular education at an early age. This commitment to education inspires curiosity, creativity, and an eagerness to ask questions, all of which I know will continue to be a central part of J-Play. Through activities, songs, stories, and Hebrew vocabulary, we will blend learning and fun for both parents and children. I will include a short list of Hebrew words to use each session, with the goals of familiarity and engagement rather than strict retention. Each session will explore a different theme that may relate to an upcoming Jewish holiday, the weekly Torah portion, or a secular topic such as our first session's Autumn theme.
