Letter from the President

Shalom Chaverim—

We've just passed the busiest time of the Jewish year. It was a great pleasure to see so many of you at High Holy Days services and at the Break Fast. We also had many visitors at our services—from as far away as Iowa, Florida, and Israel. The Israelis spoke about Israel with our children and answered questions from adults as well. More than 100 attended services on each holiday.

One highlight of the holidays was the new Star of David "cross cover" made for us by Brent Blue. He said he hoped to inspire someone talented to make a really good cover, but I think Brent's handiwork will see long service. It's our own unique folk art.

About 40 people came to Sukkot at Laurie Thal's and Russell Scott's with decorations for the Sukkah. Judd led singing and prayers while we took turns waving the lulov. And then we all danced the hora. We had a superior lulov and etrog—very important in some circles—large, nice shape, good color, etc. More impressive because we order them by mail and have to depend on someone else to choose a them.

We celebrated Simchat Torah a week later. We just made a minyon—counting the Torah. Disappointing turnout, but we started the Torah cycle again. And then, because there were only ten of us, each danced for four, as forty is the usual atten-

dance. We danced together and with the Torah. There were no dogs or children. I didn't miss the dogs, but we would have liked to see parents and kids turn out for one last brief celebration to cap off the holidays.

The headline event for October was Ben Dann's Bar Mitzvah, our first! Great job Ben!

Old Bill's Update

The final numbers are in, and this year, the Chaverim raised \$10,612.19 from 32 gifts made through Old Bill's Fun Run, before the addition of the \$4990 in matching and other funds. The total check was for \$15,602, more than \$5000 over last year's total. The Chaverim received 32 gifts, from \$10 to \$2500. Plans for using these funds include programs that promote diversity and tolerance, such as storytelling, discussion groups, and movies. (Under the terms of the grant, these funds may not be used for religious purposes.)

Thanks again to all of the donors, whose contributions can be used to foster greater understanding of the Chaverim's place in our community.
