PULITZER PRIZE WINNING AUTHOR MICHAEL CHABON TO VISIT JACKSON

The Jackson Hole Jewish Community is a proud sponsor of

the Library Foundation's "Page to the Podium" speaker series with Pulitzer Prize winning novelist Michael Chabon.

Chabon won the Pulitzer Prize in 2001 for his novel The Amazing Adventures of

Kavalier & Clay. Just this month, Chabon published his latest novel, Gentlemen of the Road, a galloping adventure along the ancient Silk Road that first appeared as a 15-part serialized novel in The New York Times Magazine. Chabon launched his literary career at age 25 with the debut of his first novel, The Mysteries of Pittsburgh, which quickly landed on the New York Times Bestseller list. His second novel, Wonder Boys, was adapted into a film, starring Michael Douglas and

Tobey Maguire, in 2000. Two years later, Chabon published

Summerland, a fantasy novel written for younger readers. He published his next novel for adults in 2007, The Yiddish Policemen's Union – a "what if" proposition where rather than creating the state of Israel,

Jewish refugees from around the world were given safe haven in Sitka, Alaska.

SURVEY RESULTS

This summer we sent out a community survey to find out what you want and need from the Jackson Hole Jewish Community. We thank the 40 individuals who took the time to thoughtfully fill out our survey. Over the next few months we will publish the responses to our questions.

The answers to the questions below demonstrated to your Board of Directors that the majority of the community is in favor of affiliating with the Reform movement. The majority of those polled also felt that the JHJC should contract with one Rabbi to provide leadership and stability to the community.

While finding a Rabbi for the community may take some time, the Board has voted to affiliate with the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ). The application process is underway and we look forward to being a member of the URJ by summer 2008.

1. Currently the JHJC is not affiliat-

ed with any Jewish movement.

Would you be in favor of affiliation? Yes: 22 No: 10 Maybe: 1 Omit: 7

If yes, which movement?

Reform: 26 Conservative: 3 Orthodox: 2 Other: 2 Omit: 7

2. Currently we do not have a fulltime Rabbi. Over the past few years we have been inviting various Rabbis to conduct services and holidays and have also had services led by lay-Rabbis and members of our own congregation.

Do you believe we need to contract with one Rabbi to provide leadership and consistency to our community?

Yes: 33 No: 7

Whether we affiliate or not, with what movement would you like the Rabbi to be most closely associated with?

Reform: 29 Orthodox: 2

Conservative: 5 Other: 4
