


Old Bill's Fun Run is September 9th

We had a lively and informative give and take over the current situation in Lebanon, the threat of Iran becoming a nuclear menace, and other topics of concern to America and Israel. In this informal, face to face meeting both Senator Thomas and Representative Cubin freely shared their ideas. There were quite a few people there for the first time, thanks to some telephone work by organizer **Joan Goldfarb**.

We were especially happy to have **Barb Watters**, former president of the Jewish congregation in Casper; and Christian friends of Israel including **Mike and Patty Atkins**, pastor of the Jackson Hole Jewish Center, and **Dr. Galbraith**, who once lived on a kibbutz. Mike Atkins was outstanding in his knowledge of Israel and ability to articulate the threats facing the Jewish state. Cliff Sobel and his wife Julie, recent arrivals in Jackson, who attended our last Shabbat service, also made the effort to come, and Cliff was much appreciated for his excellent questions and insights. It was a good chance to get to know one another and learn from each other, as well as express support for Israel to our elected officials, and thank them for their great voting records on this key issue. What a privilege to have this access to our elected government — though the topic was serious, it was a meeting that people left feeling good.
